

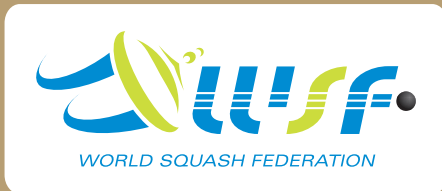

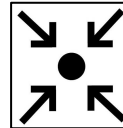

TRANSPORT

Arrival in Cologne:

Participants **having booked a package** through the Organising Committee will be met at Cologne Airport (CGN) and Cologne HBF Main railway station individually. Please refer to the central meeting points in the buildings to meet our drivers. The meeting points are in principal indicated by the following sign:

Please note that there will only be a shuttle provided if you inform us on the time and date of your arrival no later than 48 hours before you arrive in Cologne. Information number for transport is: +49 (0) 172 / 92 39 977.

There will be a shuttle service connecting the two points of arrival with the official hotel on arrival and departure day and on other days upon request.

Tournament Shuttle Bus:

A shuttle service will be operating during the tournament and connect the official hotel with the venue. The hotel is about 10 minutes from the Squash centre. The shuttle bus schedule will be available when you arrive in Cologne and check in for accreditation.

Please note that the shuttle bus only will be available to those participants having booked a package through the Organising Committee and only for tournament purposes. ELIGIBILITY

Age requirements are defined as Under 19 years of age as at the final scheduled day of the Championship event (i.e. born on or after 30 June 1991). All entrants must provide a passport as proof of eligibility. All players must be eligible to represent a Full Member Nation of the WSF.

AGE VERIFICATION

All players will be required to present their passports to the WSF Technical Director to confirm eligibility before being permitted to compete. This can be done at any time during 24 & 25 June 2010 at the Championship Office.

EYEWEAR

All participants are required to wear protective eyewear throughout the Championship in accordance with the following World Championship Regulation:

“All competitors at WSF World Junior Individual and Team Championships shall wear protective eyewear (manufactured to an appropriate national safety standard) properly over the eyes at all times during competition play. All players will be required to complete a form acknowledging acceptance and compliance with this requirement prior to competing in the championships”.

It is the responsibility of the individual player to ensure that the quality of the product worn is satisfactory for the purpose.

TOURNAMENT AND PRACTISE

PAR 11 scoring will be used (to 2 clear points).

The Championships shall be played under the latest Rules of the Singles Game of Squash as published by the WSF.

Each player has at least 5 matches. We will play off for all positions.

Practice courts will be available free of charge but must be booked in advance through the Tournament Office. Courts are available from 10:00 hrs to 18:00 hrs.

Players will be required to sign a disclaimer to this effect upon reception of their accreditation.

The Organising Committee holds insurance for liability according to German legislation only.

MANAGERS MEETING

The Managers meeting will be held on Friday, 25 June 2010, at 09:00 hrs in the ACR sports venue (meeting room 3rd floor).

CLOTHING AND ADVERTISING

The WSF clothing and advertising regulations will be adhered to. In all matters of judgement or opinion arising from the interpretation of this clothing rule, the decision of the Championships Referee shall be final, except that he/she may not rule illegal or unacceptable an item or a design which has been approved by WSF.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- Any costs due to extra services or accommodation must be paid fully by individual players to the Tournament Organising Committee prior to departure and/or the hotel respectively.
- Players are obliged to take part in all opening, medal and closing ceremonies.
- We expect that each one of you will behave as perfect ambassador for your country. The Organising Committee will not tolerate any misconduct. All cases of misconduct will be immediately handled by the Organising Committee and action will be taken such as being removed from the Tournament.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited in all premises.
- By entering the Tournament you agree with the above regulations.

IDENTITY AND ACCREDITATION CARD (IAC)

Always keep your IAC card with you, which you will also need for your meals (only applicable when you have booked a package).

REFEREEING

Willi Eickworth is the Tournament Referee and we expect that you will support his team of officials throughout the tournament. There will be official referees, but it is possible that both players will be expected to referee the following match on the same court. The loser will always be the marker and the winner will always be the referee.

TOURNAMENT OFFICE

The Tournament Office is in the ACR venue located between court number 1 (Center Court) and court 3.

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MEALS

For those participants having booked a package through the Organising Committee breakfast will be served in your hotel. Lunch and dinner will be served in the ACR restaurant located in the ACR venue.

Lunch is available from 12:00 hrs until 14:00 hrs and dinner from 18:00 hrs until 20:00 hrs. Exemptions may be made upon special agreement.

SNACKS AND BEVERAGES

Snacks and drinks are available in the ACR at any time. All snacks and drinks ordered at the bar are to be paid for immediately.

Please be informed that the ACR only accepts cash payments in Euro currency and no credit or bank cards whatsoever. There is an ATM cash machine available in the ACR.

The ACR opens at 09:00 hrs and closes at 22:00 hrs.

CHANGING ROOMS

Changing rooms are located on the first floor of the ACR venue as indicated by signs. Keys are available at the reception where a deposit must be given for the key. The deposit is returned when the key is given back to the reception.

OTHER AREAS IN THE ACR

The ACR sports centre is a large complex and is also used by other sportsmen & sportswomen and therefore we would appreciate it if you would not disturb them in their activities. Please stay out of the areas that are not assigned to the squash event. The other sports areas are for club members only and must not be used without special permission.

PLAYERS' BAG STORAGE

There is a special players' bag area next to the Centre Court. Bags will not be tolerated in the club. Bags that are lying around will be moved to the allocated area by the Organisation.

RACKET STRINGING

There will be a daily stringing service available at the booth at the reception.

ENTRY FEE

The Entry Fee is € 35,- and must be paid on arrival at the venue to the Championship Office before the scheduled start time of the Championship; failure to pay this fee will result in the player being removed from the draw.

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MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

Assistance will be on call throughout. Players who require medical attention should contact the Tournament Office. There will be a first aid service provided by the red cross. Please contact the tournament office for physiotherapy.

INTERVIEWS

Players / coaches / managers may be required in the pressroom in the tournament office for interviews after the completion of their matches. The Press Officer will contact you, and your co-operation would be appreciated.

FUNCTIONS

There will be functions throughout the event. Attendance is mandatory at all these functions. Further information will be given on arrival. The Victory & Closing ceremony will take place immediately after the finals including the prize giving ceremony. The official dinner and players' party will start at 21:30 hrs on Tuesday, 29 June 2010, at the ACR.

PRESS OFFICE

The press office will be located in the Squash Centre and will be open for Press accredited personnel only. There will be internet access in the Squash centre. The Press Office is open till 30 minutes after the last match. Access is only granted to official registered and accredited press officers.

DOPING CONTROL

All players should be aware that random doping testing could occur during the tournament. The tests will be carried out according to WSF Anti-Doping regulations and respective international standards. The WSF and DSQV reserve the right to implement compulsory dope testing for any player participating in the Championships. Dope testing may be carried out by the German National Anti Doping Agency (NADA) in line with the doping regulations published by the WSF (see below). MNAs are responsible for informing all their participants (including managers, coaches and physiotherapists) about the latest WSF policy on doping; and must impose the standard WSF suspension from all forms of competitive squash upon a player who has used banned substances or practices.

1. The WSF Anti-Doping Rules, which reflect the WADA Anti-Doping Code, apply to the World Junior Women's Squash Championships. As such, the WSF and the Host Nation reserve the right to compulsorily test for the use of prohibited substances and methods.
2. There shall be no doping before or during play in any competition under WSF Rules.
3. The 2010 list of prohibited substances and methods can be found through the WSF website at: www.worldsquash.org.uk/rul-doping.asp
4. A Declaration of Use is required at Doping Control for the following substances:
 - salbutamol and salmeterol by inhalation
 - glucocorticoids by inhalation
 - glucocorticoids administered by local injection
 - platelet-derived preparations (e.g. platelet rich plasma, "blood spinning") by non-intramuscular routes

The use of any of these medications must be declared on the doping control form if an athlete is tested.

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5. For all other medications that are prohibited but for which an athlete has a medical condition requiring the prescribed use of the medication, a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) must be obtained before the start of competition.

6. It is important to note that although salbutamol and salmeterol inhalers used for asthma are permitted, there is a urine threshold of 1000 nanograms/ml which, if exceeded, constitutes an adverse analytic finding which may result in an anti-doping violation. A maximum of 1600 micrograms over 24hrs can be used but it is important that the correct dosing frequency is followed i.e. a maximum of 400 ug (2 puffs) no more frequently than every 6 hours. For example, if an athlete chose to use a puff from an inhaler after each game, the acceptable urine threshold could be exceeded resulting in an adverse analytic finding (positive test). As noted above, the use of these inhalers must be declared on the doping control form.

7. As noted above, Glucocorticoids that are used for asthma in inhalers are permitted as are corticosteroids that are injected into a joint, bone, tendon or ligament. Their use must be declared on the doping control form.

8. It is important to note that pseudoephedrine, a medication that is commonly found in over the counter cough, cold, sinus, decongestant medicines, is prohibited above a urine threshold of 150 micrograms/ml. As the medication is variably absorbed into the blood system, regular doses of pseudoephedrine can result in the urine threshold level being exceeded. So, it is recommended that athletes stop taking any medicines containing pseudoephedrine at least 24hrs before competition.

9. Any athlete refusing to undergo doping control and any athlete found to have an anti-doping violation will be dealt with by the WSF, which shall take disciplinary action in accordance with the WSF Anti-Doping Rules.

10. All coaches, officials and athlete support personnel are subject to the WADA Code and the WSF Anti-Doping Rules. Any coach, official, or support personnel who provide athletes with prohibited substances or are found to possess prohibited substances for which the individual is not prescribed may be subject to an anti-doping violation under the WADA Code.

11. All players and officials have to sign an anti-doping form prior to the event. This form will be sent to all participating member nations after the closing date. The form has to be presented on arrival at the venue to the Championship Office before the scheduled start time of the Championship.

DEPARTURE

Players leaving will be dropped off at Cologne Main station (HBF) or Cologne Airport (CGN) respectively. Players and Officials should confirm to the Tournament Office about their flight details as early as possible (but not later than 72 hours before they leave). If not confirmed there will be no transportation arrangement! A form to complete the details will be provided.

Players / coaches / managers should ensure that all outstanding charges are cleared at the hotel and the organising committee prior to their departure.

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Förderhinweis Sportland Nordrhein-Westfalen



Sportland Nordrhein-Westfalen

Am 12. Februar 2008 haben die Landesregierung Nordrhein-Westfalen und der Landessportbund zur Schaffung eines Netzwerkes für den Sport das „Bündnis für den Sport“ unterzeichnet. Gemeinsames Ziel ist es, das Ehrenamt und Bürgerengagement zu stärken sowie gesellschaftlich bedeutsame Sportangebote ebenso zu fördern wie Infrastruktur und Sportstätten.

Das Sportland Nordrhein-Westfalen ist bekannt für seine vielfältigen Bemühungen und Initiativen im Leistungssport. Der Leistungssport ist aber mehr als nur der primär im Blickpunkt der sportinteressierten Öffentlichkeit stehende Wettkampf von Spitzenathletinnen und -athleten. Leistungssport ist ein zentrales Segment im Handlungsfeld Sport, das neben den innersportlichen Sinngebungen für die Aktiven durch die von ihm ausgehenden Wertstellungen, Anreize und Vorbilder von großer gesellschaftlicher Bedeutung ist.

Ziel der Talentsuche und Talentförderung im Verbund von Schule und Verein/Verband ist es, Kindern und Jugendlichen den Weg zum Leistungssport zu eröffnen. Dazu werden die Nachwuchssportlerinnen und -sportler bei der Bewältigung der schulischen und sportlichen Anforderungen in den 40 Sportinternaten des "Verbundsystems Schule und Leistungssport in Nordrhein-Westfalen" durch flankierende pädagogische Betreuung zusätzlich unterstützt.

Große Anstrengungen seitens der Landesregierung, einiger Ausbildungsbetriebe, Unternehmen und Hochschulen Nordrhein-Westfalens werden unternommen, auch während der Berufsausbildung und des Studiums wirksame Unterstützungsmaßnahmen für die sportlichen Nachwuchseliten, die sich zwangsläufig in dem Spannungsfeld von Leistungssport und Bildungsweg befinden, anzubieten.

Bundesweite Beachtung finden die Arbeiten zur Entwicklung und Erprobung neuer Konzeptionen für das Training und den Wettkampf von Kindern und Jugendlichen im Leistungssport. Die Ausbildung allgemeiner, koordinativer und konditioneller Fähigkeiten durch eine vielseitige, sportartübergreifende Grundausbildung sind die Leitlinien dieser Arbeit. Auch hier, in diesem so wichtigen Bereich einer humanen Nachwuchsförderung im Leistungssport, nimmt Nordrhein-Westfalen in Deutschland eine Vorreiterrolle ein.

Im Sportland Nordrhein-Westfalen steht aber nicht nur der Leistungssport im Fokus. Nordrhein-Westfalen bekennt sich vielmehr zum Sport in seiner ganzen Vielfalt.

Hierzu gehören der Breitensport für alle, der Vereins- und Schulsport sowie der Behindertensport und die Förderung bislang benachteiligter Gruppen durch Integrationsprojekte.

Der Sport leistet in Nordrhein-Westfalen einen wichtigen Beitrag für die Gesundheit der Menschen und steht in besonderem Maße für Gemeinschaftssinn und Verständigung.

Zahlreiche Landesinitiativen, Modellprojekte und Kampagnen sind deshalb darauf ausgerichtet, den Sport in seiner bunten Vielfalt zu erhalten und weiterzuentwickeln.

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Mit einem „Handlungsprogramm Sport und Gesundheit“ werden

- die Qualität und Quantität sportlicher Angebote im Präventions- und Rehabilitationsbereich ausgebaut,
- das öffentliche Bewusstsein für die Notwendigkeit der gesundheitlichen Prävention durch Sport gestärkt
- und den Tendenzen zu steigendem Übergewicht und mangelnder Schwimmfähigkeit in der Bevölkerung entgegengewirkt.

Handlungskonzepte wie z.B. „Zukunft gestalten-aktiv und bewegt älter werden“, „Familie und Sport“ und „Sporttrends in NRW“ sprechen gezielt ältere Menschen und die große Zahl der unorganisiert Sporttreibenden, insbesondere der Kinder und Jugendlichen an, mit dem Ziel, den Sport im Verein wieder interessanter und vergnüglicher zu machen .
